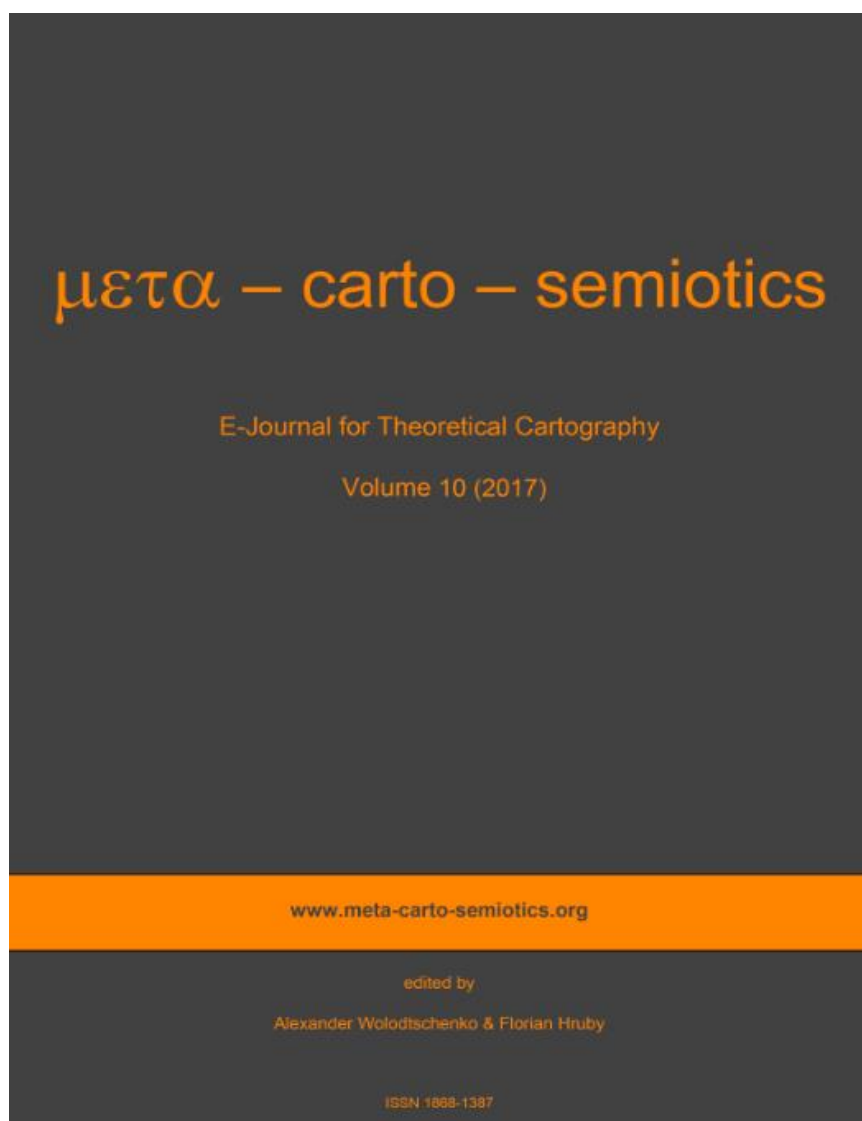


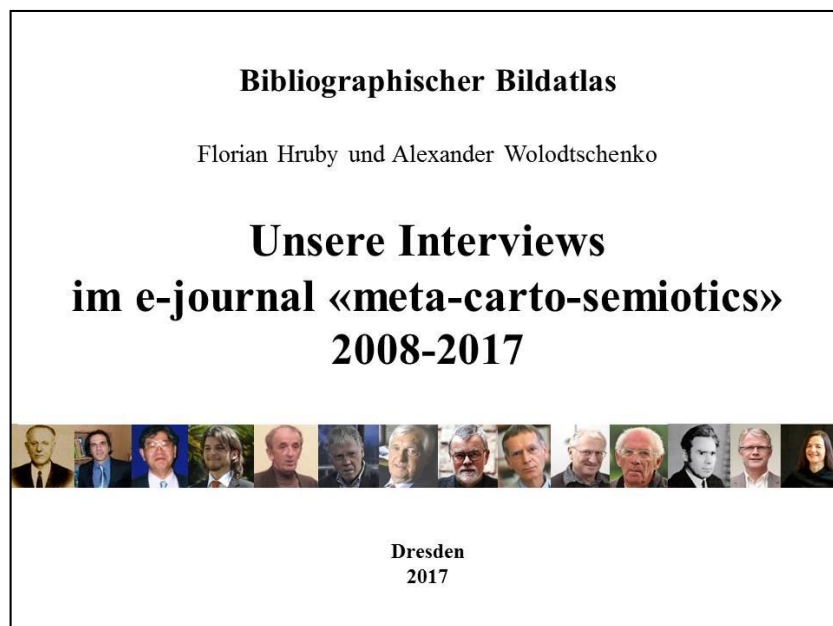
# 10 years / 10 volumes meta-carto-semiotics (2008-2017)

Meta-carto-semiotics, an interdisciplinary, bilingual, open-access online journal for theoretical aspects of cartography goes ten. In 2017, the journal will launch volume 10, and is, thus, starting to make tradition. This tradition has developed during an interesting time, where the alternation of generations in cartography is clearly visible. At the same time, meta-carto-semiotics was the little sister of the (15 years young) cartosemiotic series “Discussion contributions to cartosemiotics and theoretical cartography” (editors H. Schlichtmann and A. Wolodtschenko).

With this piece of work, the editors of meta-carto-semiotics will try to analyse and summarize the journal’s activities within the landscape of academic German and English. Statistical and structure-related data shall be presented. In times of technological dominance in cartography and its transformation-to and or fusion-with geoinformatics and geomatics, cartosemiotic knowledge and theoretical-conceptual thinking play an important role. The bibliographic photoatlas “Unsere Interviews im e-journal <meta-carto-semiotics> 2008-2017” completes a statistical data.



During the last 10 years, meta-carto-semiotics has tried to work and to draw attention especially on these topics of theoretical cartography and cartosemiotics. Together with the paper print journal “Discussion contributions to cartosemiotics and theoretical cartography”, meta-carto-semiotics has become a platform of accumulation of carto-semiotic-theoretical knowledge, and has tried to remind the scientific community that without such theoretical knowledge cartography may be transformed from science to craft.
